# Gatwick Express

#### Catch the train to catch the plane

Gatwick Airport station is directly below the South Terminal. Lifts and escalators link the platforms with the main part of the airport so you can step off the train onto the plane. In fact GATWICK EXPRESS offers everything today's travellers need to make their journey complete.

#### **From Gatwick Airport**

GATWICK EXPRESS services leave the airport every 15 minutes during the day, and every 30 minutes early in the morning and late at night. Journey times are 35 minutes on Sundays. With this frequent service from early morning until late at night, seat reservations are not *required*.


Return tickets last for one month, single tickets for three days. For those meeting friends a Day Return fare is available. Please enquire when making your holiday arrangements.

#### Other rail services to Gatwick

Passengers to the north-west of England and the Midlands can now enjoy high-speed services direct to and from Gatwick Airport, avoiding changing trains in London.

If you are travelling to Gatwick from *further afield* and your rail

journey is across London, you can now use your ticket to transfer by London Underground between your station terminal and Victoria at no extra cost.


